Business arising from Previous Meeting:

- 1. Illa Langi Road Crown Lands will allow maintenance once a section 138 has been lodged and approved by council. Fees Crown Lands \$290, Section 138 \$160.
 - **Action:** Ralph to proceed with paperwork.
- 2. Letters to members regarding slashing and tidying sites. Currently working on a letter to send to identified members based on RFS recommendations. Allow to mid-April for slashing and tidying of sites. Deadlines for slashing sites are marked on the Goolawah calendar.
- 3. Policy and Guidelines Committee Denise, Peter, Roger, James and Trinh volunteered to review and update policies, procedures, guidelines and rules. Approved Job List has been amended, also added Phone Tree management (approved June CM 2017).
- 4. DFT Rule updates from January GM. Ralph has completed the form and posted to DFT.
- 5. Letter to Callum regarding visitors. Callum explained Dave van Meg was a 'buddy' for his visitors during his absence. A reminder to advise the Membership Committee and inform via phone tree when a buddy has been organized for visitors.
- 6. Communal water supply at Burrendong and The Bowl. Keith has posted a solar pump proposal on the website. He provided an overview, cost \$50 \$100 for dam users wishing to contribute. Kevin suggested some amendments. Usage of water will also need to be addressed. Possibility of future dam in the camp kitchen area was mentioned.

Action: Keith and Kevin to coordinate, and invite dam users to a meeting to discuss the proposal, technical details and installation of the system. Other members interested in resource management may wish to attend.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Byron Reynolds from Crown Lands advised he's unable to address the issue of Mark Dunn encroaching on Illa Langi Road verge without a full survey. Crown Lands have a survey of the northern side of the road but not the southern side. Hazards on roads / inappropriate behaviour have been reported along Illa Langi Road eg. neighbours letterbox set on fire, dog has been baited, flat tyres.....

Action: Ralph to confirm what has been surveyed with Dave Launt. Report on at the March CM.

DA Report: No news on section 96.

Road Report: Roads are in good condition. Some of the budget can be used for fire break maintenance.

Membership Report:

<u>Machinery Report</u>: Currently no issues. Wheel tightened on tractor. OH&S law stipulates NO PASSENGERS on tractor.

Action: Add NO PASSENGERS on tractor to Tractor and Machinery Policy.

<u>Fire Report</u>: Fire extinguisher and blanket in camp kitchen needs to be checked and lodged with Fire services in Sydney. Fees \$56 for check, \$96 for council. Hefty fines for non-compliance.

Draft Fire Action Plan – Roger, Peter, Michael and others have been working on the Draft Fire Action which is on the website. We may need to submit a Hazard Reduction Application with RFS. George McKeon has given a quote estimate of (max.) \$20,000 to clear fire breaks, but will bill us an hourly rate of \$210 (plus GST) - using a heavy excavator and mulcher - with opportunities to review progress as the work proceeds so that we can stop or adjust the program. The Fire Action Plan will take time to fully implement, and first priority will be clearing fire breaks. All community members will have to actively participate in ensuring our future fire safety, and take responsibility for improving fire risk reduction on their own sites.

Bamboo fencing nil cost. Overall budget say \$1000 plus geotechnical report. DA approval required for every burial.

- 3. Work Claims. Peter suggested claims be allowed for the Work Levy only ie not the Annual Levy. Discussion ensued for and against. Continue discussion into the future.
- 4. Longboard artwork completed by Alwyn Wayne suggested this be completed and displayed at the camp kitchen. Alwyn has spent \$130 to date.
