- Clarifying 2/3 majority vote Abstentions don't count as part of vote. Only for and against votes are counted.
- Printing solutions for Goolawah Gazette (Julica/Peter/Ralph E.) letter read by Cindee on behalf of Julica (survey results):

"Since Ralph's equipment doesn't allow printing of the Gazette in Goolawah anymore (see discussion and minutes of April meeting), we're looking for other options.

Printing 14 pages in colour (for example at OfficeWorks) costs about \$12 per 14-page newsletter. This was considered too expensive. Another option is printing in black and white at 80 cents a copy whilst the colour version of the Gazette will still be available as pdf on the website. Everyone can print it from there if they want their own colour copy.

The last meeting voted for the b&w option, but the chair decided to include more views and opinions so we asked for input via an online survey.

23 Goolawah members participated in the week long survey and answered as follows:

- > 0% voted for keep receiving colour copy of gazette and happy to pay approximately \$12 per copy
- > 52% voted for receiving a black and white copy with colour version available online
- > 44% voted for members who want the gazette in colour should pay \$12
- ➤ 4% voted for printing gazette in colour should continue and be paid for by everyone The next Gazette (June 15) will therefore be printed in b/w with colour options available on

 - Goolie Bee Club further to website discussion (Trinh)- looking for clarification about how to move forward. Taking into consideration discussion of management plan for Goolie bee club from Goolawah website.
 - Do we change by-law #8 or keep by-law and not permit introduced bee hives? If we are to change the amendment then it is essential for a member to propose an amendment to bylaw and bring to a meeting for voting.
 - Community discussion extended about pros and cons of native bees versus European bees and further management.
 - Trinh has offered extensive research on native /feral/managed Bees by NPWS and other valuable resources for members to view at their leisure.
 - Motion to set up a workshop for those parties interested. Possibly invite NPWS/NSW NP to understand where they stand on this topic.
 - Proposal to be made for next meeting.

• Road engineering plans for Nevertire Rd. (Ralph E.) –letter received yesterday from KSC. Council happy for us to do Nevertire Road in 4 stages. First stage to be completed by May 2020. Stage 2 by May 2021 and stage 3 by May 2022. Final stage 4 to be completed within

12 months of Maria River Road being tarred. Possible issue is that the council have requested that the first 400m from North gate to be 6m wide tarred road and the rest to be 4m wide.

- OH&S book/manual for Goolawah machinery/Slasher (Kevin) Clutch on old tractor/slasher blown. To be fixed on both slashers?

Machinery Report:

Clutch on old tractor/slasher blown. To be fixed on both slashers?

Kevin has been working in fire trails around Nevertire and Frog Hollow.

New tractor- flange for oil now fixed and working well.

Fire Squad Report:

\$2200 spent on mulching fire break on frog hollow. Will still require some cleaning up (possibly to be included in a Working bee).

Harvey raised concern about pile of tyres on Russell's site that pose a threat as toxic combustible waste. Roger stated that it is on Goolawah fire management plan to be dealt with.

Roger requested that members make the most of the debris/burn piles on Frog Hollow and use this for personal firewood usage.

Frank has put a fire reel to be hooked up at camp kitchen. Roger requesting funds for fittings, nozzles and brackets to set up.

Regarding Note 1 of Treasurer's report: Unclaimed unidentified receipts current total \$6282.94.

Proposal - Treasurer recommends that we establish a policy that we only retain liability for unidentified receipts for the current and immediately previous financial years. Add to finance policy.

Regarding Note 2 of Treasurer's report: Ironstone dam budget blown

Approval for rehabilitation of Ironstone Dam was given at 2017 meeting but no actual budget was given. Directors gave approval for \$3700 including Bentonite clay which Mark Doonan paid for. Total Invoiced for \$4900.

Glen had worked on several other sites on Goolawah and had invoiced on target to quotes.

However, this was different for the Ironstone Dam rehabilitation.

Mark agreed to contact the contractor Glen, to query the quote and get back to community/directors.

Meeting reiterated the need for all future quotes to be in writing.

Last resort Report:

Work done at last working bee.

Two more coats of render on walls to go and one more door to install.

Process of updating new financial budget for Last Resort for next financial year needs to be considered.

More physical support and enthusiasm for Last resort working bees would be appreciated.

Directors Report:

There is a need for longer-range planning of budgets and project oversight as Goolawah becomes a larger community as sites fill up. Currently joining fees are providing the necessary income to complement our levies to meet our budget needs but it is still anticipated this will fall off

If our income exceeds \$150,000, we will need to consider paying GST which would either add 10% to our levies or reduce our available income by 10%. This is not foreseen in the immediate future but may nee to be considered eventually. Implications to be explored.
